You know, we're in the same spot, I guess, as what's going on in discovery. We have remand deadlines coming up for us to submit lists to you for proposed cases in early January and then again in March, and we anticipate being able to wrap up those Group 8(a) and 8(b) cases by those two deadlines.

THE COURT: Okay. Anything to add on that for the Plaintiffs' Steering Committee?

MS. FULMER: No, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Okay. And I guess I've already touched on Topic 4.

I'm trying to figure out what would be the best time for the next conference. I don't want to have something where we're just getting together just to say we got together. But on the other hand, I don't want to run it so far out that things would not be able to get addressed as needed.

Sixty days out, somewhere in the January range, would put us before the objections to remand in 8(a), while discovery is still alive in 8(b). Would that kind of time frame sound reasonable or do you think something further down the road would be justified?

I'll start with the Steering Committee.

MS. FULMER: Your Honor, I think that 60 days out would be an appropriate time frame for us to have the next status conference. And perhaps if it's a light agenda, as is

1 today, we might be able to do -- I would request that we be 2 able to do that by phone, with the plan to have a more 3 substantive conference probably in March in person. 4 THE COURT: Okay. And for the Defense? 5 MR. WINTER: Makes good sense to us, Your Honor. THE COURT: Okay. How about 1:00 on January 11th? 6 That's a Monday. I'm just trying to stay out of the way of 7 others who might need courtrooms. I can move it on down 8 9 further that week, but it's more likely to have to be done by 10 phone the deeper into the week I get. So, say, 1:00 on January 11<sup>th</sup> would give us a better option for in-person. Do 11 12 you want to go with that? 13 MS. FULMER: Your Honor, this is Brenda Fulmer on 14 behalf of the Plaintiffs. 15 I had actually requested that the Court consider doing it by telephone. If this hearing is held on 16 17 January 11th, I won't be able to travel in time to appear in person, but I could appear on the 11<sup>th</sup> by phone, if 18 19 necessary. 20 THE COURT: Oh, you know what; I'm looking at 21 January, 2021. Let me get a little more realistic here. 22 How about -- how about the -- I'm trying to spare you having to come in the night before but still have a courtroom. 23 How about 1:00 on January 22<sup>nd</sup>? And we can convert that to 24 25 in-person, if necessary, I think. Would that time and date

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work for you, to be set telephonically?

               MS. FULMER: Your Honor, for the Plaintiff, I am
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     available on that date telephonically. If it is an in-person
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     conference, I'm going to ask somebody else on the Steering

     Committee to travel to South Bend to appear. But either way,
